

# Completed Airport Corridor Action Team Actions and Accomplishments

1. Completed the Dorothy L. Jones Health & Community Center.
2. Investigated complaints of industrial dumping and garbage in streets and waterways.
3. Investigated complaints and graded ditch along Bieghle (both City and County sides).
4. Developed a waterway clean up program along Duck Creek with Sierra Vista Housing Authority, local schools and police department.
5. Investigated sanitary sewer odor complaints
6. Updated storm drain master plan.
7. Coordinated water capacity study with Cal Water (which included pipe maintenance program)
8. Made storm drain improvements along Airport Corridor for Streetscape project.
9. Established an undergrounding district for utilities along Airport Way from MLK to Duck Creek.
10. Adopted an Airport Corridor Streetscape Master Plan.
11. Improved curb, gutter, sidewalk and ADA cuts in neighborhood with Strong Neighborhoods Initiative Funds
12. Streets resurfaced with Strong Neighborhoods Initiative Funds (most work around Ophir, Spring and 9<sup>th</sup> Streets).
13. Trimmed or removed trees along Airport Way from MLK to Carpenter for Streetscape Beautification.
14. Suppressed loitering, gambling, violent crime, drug sales and curfew violations.
15. Addressing truancy in local schools.

16. Coordinated parole and probation searches/violation investigations in neighborhood.
17. Increased police staffing and resources in neighborhood.
18. Assisted neighborhood groups in the closure of Tropicana Bar due to safety violations.
19. Established a mentoring program at Nightengale School.
20. Added multilingual outreach and presentations to local organizations for fire safety and smoke detector installations.
21. Completed a needs assessment to renovate or relocate Fire Station #3.
22. Completed vacant lot actions for more than 17 vacant lots.
23. Inspected and initiated appropriate action for more than 23 commercial and residential buildings including the zero tolerance enforcement at Grand Save Market.
24. Inspected more than 500 residential properties for visual blight.
25. Held Town Hall meetings, community meetings, groundbreaking events, and celebrations to meet neighbors and provide information about ongoing activities and actions in the neighborhood.
26. Completed a feasibility study for a neighborhood service center (site selection).
27. Built a 6,000 square foot community and health center at Williams Brotherhood Park named the Dorothy L. Jones Community and Health Center on Fair Street.
28. Applied for and secured \$426,000 grant for equipment for Health Center.
29. CUFF developed a commitment and service plan for the community and health services at the Dorothy L. Jones Center.
30. Developed and promoted homebuyer assistance program, down payment assistance program, home ownership training programs and low cost loans for residents in this neighborhood.
31. Identified parcels for possible future development by redevelopment.

32. Assisted owners with potential plans to add affordable housing to the neighborhood.
33. Assisted Visionary Home Builders, Inc. in the development of affordable housing units in South Stockton.
34. Initiated a Master Development Area for vacant lots along Airport Way.
35. Initiated a Master Development Area for D Street to promote affordable housing.
36. Implemented outreach assistance to neighborhood partners for employment services and programs at Job Fairs and CUFF Center.
37. Promoted and extended Enterprise Zone Designation for South Stockton businesses and residents.
38. Created job readiness opportunities before job fairs through Worknet partner.
39. Held workshops for small businesses and residents regarding the PUC energy efficiency grant for two grant cycles with PG&E.
40. Completed a business license study to assess current small business in neighborhood.
41. Mailed questionnaires and completed a case study for successful small businesses in the neighborhood.
42. Implemented outreach and series of small business workshops with Small Business Development Center for potential new small business owners.
43. Retained a retail expert to develop a list of viable business for the residents and workforce along Airport Way through the Economic Development Department.
44. Expanded the Commercial Façade Loan Program boundaries to include Airport Corridor and implemented outreach program to support new applications from the neighborhood.
45. Held five job fairs at the Fairgrounds with Worknet.
46. Completed a traffic calming program around Sharps Lane Villas/Nightengale School.
47. Added six stop signs around Nightengale School.

48. Initiated a free abandoned car towing program
49. Completed alley clean ups with CCC and AWP and continue on a complaint basis.
50. Assisted with Commercial Development at Rancho San Miguel.
51. Park improvements (tot lot, restroom improvements) in Rev. Williams Park.
52. Security cameras added to Park and Airport Way.
