**RESOLUTION APPROVING THE CITY-INITIATED STREET NAME CHANGE FOR
THE PORTION OF CHARTER WAY BETWEEN STATE ROUTE 99 AND
INTERSTATE 5 TO THE DUAL NAME OF DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.
BOULEVARD/CHARTER WAY (SN2-03)**

WHEREAS, the proposed street name change (SN2-03) has been properly initiated in accordance with the City Manager's Directive (CD-007); and

WHEREAS, the Development Review Committee pursuant to said directive reviewed and recommended to the Planning Commission approval of renaming the portion of Charter Way between State Route 99 and Interstate 5 to Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said directive, the City Planning Commission held a duly noticed public hearing on August 28, 2003, and recommended approval of the proposal of the City of Stockton to rename the noted portion of Charter Way to the dual name of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard/Charter Way; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by the City Council on November 25, 2003; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

A. That the portion of Charter Way between State Route 99 and Interstate 5 is hereby renamed to the dual name of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard/Charter Way, based on the following findings:

1. The street name change has been reviewed against the Development Review Committee's Street Naming Policy and the City Manager's Administrative Directive on Renaming Existing Streets and has been determined to be in compliance with the noted policy and directive.


2. The proposal has been determined to be exempt from environmental assessment requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under the "general rule" that CEQA only applies to projects which have the


potential for causing significant environmental effects, as specified in Section 15061(b)(3).

B. The street name change shall become effective on January 1, 2004, and thereafter, affected business and property owners may use either "Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard" or "Charter Way" as their street name until January 1, 2009; thereafter, the name shall be "Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard."
