Beneath downtown Stockton lie remains from our City's rich and diverse history. In the 19th century, the site of what is now the City Centre Cinemas was at the heart of Stockton's first Chinatown. In 2000, archaeologists excavated and uncovered the site of the Sing Lee Laundry that was operated by Chinese immigrants from the 1890s to the 1930s.

Archeologists from Sonoma State University excavated the site in 2000 and completed an exhibit of selected artifacts from the laundry. The exhibit is located in the lobby of The (Hotel) Stockton.

Details of the excavation have been provided for school children on the City's web site in an interactive program called, "City Beneath Your Feet." The web site has been so popular that students asked for something they could experience by seeing the artifacts themselves. The exhibit brings the web site to life for the entire community.

The dedication of this exhibit is the culmination of months of work and a celebration of the preservation of our history.
