

Project Information

The City of Stockton will be rehabilitating the existing sewer trunk line along Alexandria Place. As part of the improvements, traffic control and temporary sewer bypass pumping will be required. Please note that Alexandria Place will be open for traffic during construction but with restrictions.

The Contractor will notify adjacent residents, businesses and schools prior to starting construction. Construction is anticipated to begin June 24, 2019 and take approximately 3 months.

Alexandria Sewer Trunk Line is 48-inch and 54-inch sewer trunk line located along Alexandria Place between 14 Mile Slough and Swenson Golf Course.

Trenchless Technology

The method being used to repair the sewer pipeline is called Cured-in-Place Lining, or CIPP. The CIPP method builds a pipe within a pipe by inflating a fabric liner soaked in resin. The liner is a woven or knit fabric with a PVC coating, manufactured to match the diameter of the in-place pipe. The liner is saturated in resin on site that chemically cures in place. Because its CIPP, it does not require digging, and minimizes resident disruption.

The resins are low-odor; however, there may be some chemical smell while the liner is curing.

After the liner has been installed, a camera is sent down to inspect the final work.

Night Work

The size and length of this pipe will require boilers and pumps. The Contractor will have multiple boilers and pumps on site to provide power and decrease the length of the cure time. However, the process will extend past normal working hours, which are 7:00a.m. to 10:00p.m. on weekdays.

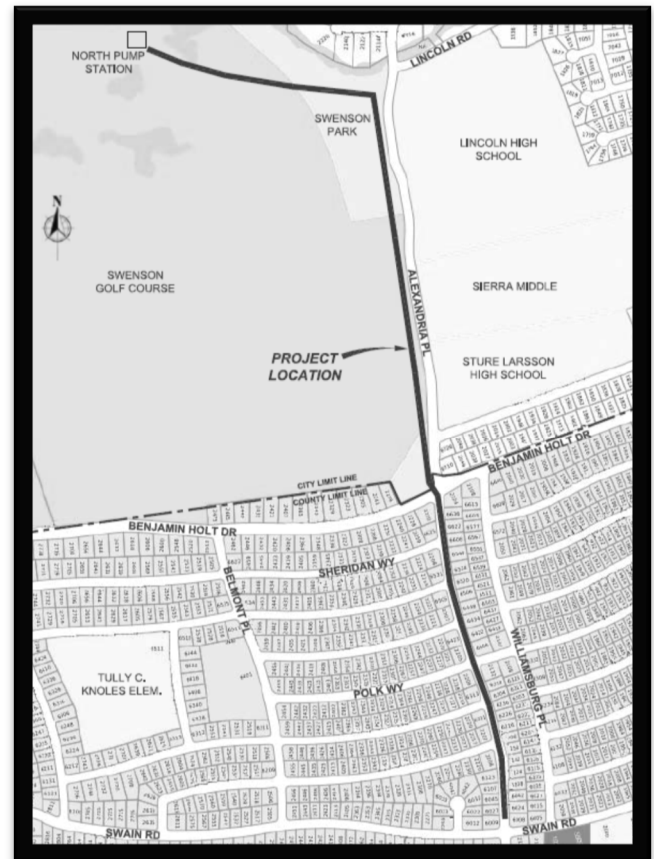
Safety
