**I. POLICY**

It is the policy of the Stockton Police Department to deal appropriately with active duty military personnel who have been victims of violent crime, have been arrested for a criminal offense, or have been killed within the Stockton city limits.

**II. PROCEDURE**

- A. The United States Armed Forces no longer has a clearing house that deals with all branches of the active military. Stockton Police Personnel who have contact with active members of the military who have been victims of violent crime, who have been arrested for a criminal offense, or who has been killed in the City of Stockton shall contact the nearest military instillation that the person is enlisted in. Appropriate telephone numbers can be located in the Government Section of the telephone book. During normal business hours, officers may contact local recruiting office in Stockton for correct telephone numbers.
- B. If the member of the active military is arrested for a criminal violation, the officer should contact the appropriate military instillation prior to booking the subject at the San Joaquin County Jail.
- C. If the member of the military has been a victim of violent crime or has been killed within the jurisdiction of the City of Stockton shall contact the appropriate military instillation as soon possible.
