Governor Gavin Newsom announced that all sectors other than retail and essential operations will close when Regional hospital Intensive Care Unit (ICU) bed capacity has fallen below 15% of available capacity.

Regional Stay Home Order California's Regional Stay Home Order goes into effect after a region reaches less than 15% ICU availabilty. For our Region, the order goes into effect Sunday, December 6th at 11:59 pm as we have fallen below the threshold. MODIFY OPERATIONS 100% MASKING & PHYSICAL DISTANCING

The following sectors will have additional modifications, including 100% masking and physical distancing:

- Outdoor recreational facilities: Allow outdoor operation only without any food, drink or alcohol sales; overnight stays at campgrounds are not permitted.
- Retail: Allow indoor operation at 20% capacity with entrance metering no eating/drinking in stores. Special hours for seniors and others with chronic conditions or compromised immune systems.
- **Shopping centers:** Allow indoor operations at 20% capacity with entrance metering no eating/drinking in stores. Special hours for seniors and others with chronic conditions or compromised immune systems.
- Hotels and lodging: Allow to open for critical infrastructure support only.
- Restaurants: Allow only for take-out, pick-up, or delivery.
- Offices: Allow remote only except for critical infrastructure sectors where remote working is not possible.
- Places of worship and political expression: Allow outdoor services only.
- Entertainment production, including professional sports: Allow operation without live audiences; testing protocols and "bubbles are highly encouraged.

REMAIN OPEN - 100% MASKING & PHYSICAL DISTANCING

The following sectors are allowed to remain open when a remote option is not possible with appropriate infectious disease preventative measures, including 100% masking and physical distancing:

- Critical infrastructure
- Schools (Schools that are currently open are able to continue to provide in-person instruction on school sites.)
- Non-urgent medical and dental care
- Childcare and pre-K
