### Construction and Demolition (C&D) Recycling Requirements

The State of California requires that all cities in the state divert 50% of its waste materials from landfills (AB 939). The City of Stockton could face fines of up to \$10,000 a day for not meeting this requirement. Construction and demolition debris accounts for about 20-30% of all the waste disposed in our landfills. Recycling is therefore essential for meeting state goals and requirements.

**Stockton Municipal Code, Section 8.28.030, requires everyone seeking a new building or demolition permit to identify all debris materials at the time of the permit application. Further, all new building construction projects and complete demolitions are required to recycle at least 50% of the materials generated by their project. A final disposal and recycling report must be submitted to the City within 60 days of job completion, together with all receipts and weight tickets.** Please refer to the *Resource List* for haulers that are permitted to transport debris, and drop-off facilities that recycle self-hauled materials.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS** (please call 209- 937-7579 for more information)

1. Complete, sign and submit the attached **Construction/Demolition Recycling Plan**.
2. If you plan to self haul your waste, use the attached **Resource List** to find facilities that will recycle your materials, or hire one of the City's permitted collectors for recycling service. **Always ask the recycling facility or collector for all your weight tickets and receipts!**
3. Once your project is complete, you must submit the attached **Construction and Demolition Debris Recycling Report within 60 days** of project completion. Make sure **to include all weight tickets and receipts for all your recycled and disposed materials.**
4. Your final report should include the following information:
  - a. Types and quantities (tons) of materials recycled, reused or salvaged
  - b. Types and quantities (tons) of materials disposed at landfills
  - c. Final destination of materials, or hauler, **with all weight tags and receipts**
  - d. Method of transport for your debris materials (self-haul, container, or debris box)

### Demolition Projects

#### Deconstruction

Deconstruction is a cost saving alternative to traditional complete demolition by recycling, reusing or reselling materials instead of just dumping them in landfills. The advantages of deconstruction may include tax deductions for material donations, cost-savings by reusing materials, preservation of vintage architecture and avoidance of city fines and permit delays.

Salvaged items in working condition, such as double-pane windows, lighting fixtures, cabinets, ceiling fans, doors, etc., can be dropped off at:

**To calculate the percentage of materials recycled and/or reused:**

To determine the percentage of material recycled/reused, divide the number of tons which were recycled/reused by the TOTAL tonnage generated by this job.

$$\text{Percent Recycled and Reused} = \frac{\text{recycling} + \text{reused tons}}{\text{recycling tons} + \text{reused tons} + \text{disposed tons}}$$

*Example:*  $\frac{1 \text{ ton recycling} + 1 \text{ ton reused}}{1 \text{ ton recycling} + 1 \text{ ton reused} + 2 \text{ tons disposal}} = \frac{2}{4} = 0.5$  (multiply 0.5 by 100 = 100%)

**Salvaged Materials:**

Please estimate the quantity of material recycled/reused. Your estimates should be provided in tons.

*Example:* 25 pounds ÷ 2000 pounds = 0.02 tons

**How to convert pounds into tons:**

To convert pounds to tons, divide the number of pounds by 2000 lbs. 1 ton = 2,000 pounds

*Example:* 700 pounds ÷ 2000 pounds = 0.35 tons

**How to convert cubic yards into tons:**

Select the type of material recycled/reused from the chart to the right →

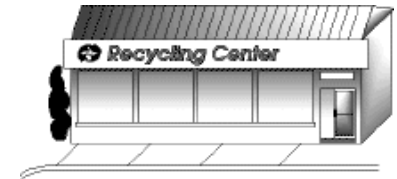
Multiply the corresponding number by the total number of cubic yards recycled/reused.

1 cubic yard of asphalt = 0.69 tons

*Example:* 5 c.y. of asphalt = 5 X 0.69 = 3.45 tons

### Important Notes:

If you are operating under a permit application issued by the City of Stockton, **you must use a City of Stockton permitted waste hauler, or a permitted commercial recyclable material collector for the collection/hauling** of your waste materials. Always ask the hauler for your receipts and/ or weight tickets.

Permit applicants / holders may **self haul** their OWN materials from their OWN job site with their OWN vehicles, equipment and workers. The reverse side provides drop-off facilities that will recycle your self hauled materials.

Source separated recyclables, such as clean metal (i.e. AC units, water heaters), wood, concrete, or drywall / sheetrock may be collected and hauled by a permitted **Commercial Recyclable Material Collector** according to Stockton Municipal Code 8.04.270 & 8.04.280

**Commercial Recyclable Material Collectors** (i.e. junk haulers, metal haulers) may be added to this list if a Recyclable Material Collector Permit has been issued by the City of Stockton. This permit is free of charge and the only requirement for this permit is that these collectors recycle at least 90% of each load they collect, and that they report quarterly all materials collected, recycled and disposed of to the City of Stockton Solid Waste & Recycling division. Please call (209) 937-7579 if you like to receive an application for the Recyclable Material Collector Permit.
