-  Residents also have a choice of a 30- or 90-gallon recycling cart if either size better suits their needs.

#### **Please note:**

All appliances should have cord removed prior to placement in recycling cart.

All electronic scrap must have batteries\* removed prior to placement in recycling cart.

\* Household batteries will be picked up curbside *only* if they are sealed in clear plastic bags and placed on the ground outside and next to the recycling cart.

## Green Waste and Food Waste (Green Lid)



Standard service includes a 90-gallon wheeled cart for green and food waste.



Residents can request additional 90-gallon green waste/food waste carts, if necessary year-round, at no additional cost.



### Green Waste

- ☞ Branches (less than 3" diameter)
- ☞ Brush
- ☞ Cut flowers
- ☞ Dead plants
- ☞ Grass clippings

## Trash (Gray Lid)



Choice of 30-, 60- or 90-gallon cart for items that cannot be recycled through the City's recycling program.



Monthly service cost is determined by the size of the trash cart you chose.

## Curbside Collection of Household Hazardous Waste

Stockton residents will be provided a curbside collection of used oil, oil filters and household batteries at no additional charge. Since used oil, oil filters and household batteries are considered hazardous waste, special handling is required.

When securely placed on the ground outside and next to the recycling cart, these items will be collected separately on your regular service day.

- Used oil will be picked up *only* if it is sealed in a clear plastic jug with screw top lid;
- Used oil filters will be picked up *only* if they are sealed in clear plastic bags; and,
- Household batteries will be picked up *only* if they are sealed in clear plastic bags.

**Do not** contaminate your carts with these hazardous items.
